Inspection Rules

- 1. Only one split on cost between 2 breeders allowed with no more than 1 hour travel between flocks or 2 flocks in one location. Multiple breeders at one location is not allowed.
- Breeders with the following number of sheep will be required to have help as listed.
 1-50 head (no extra help)
 51-75 head (1 extra helper)
 76-100 head (2 extra helpers)
 Above 101 head (2 days for inspection and 2 extra helpers)
 Above 175 head (3 days for inspection and 2 extra helpers)
 It's not the inspector's job to chase and catch your animals in the pens
- 3. All animals that are being offically typed are required to have a typing tag. If the breeder does not want the typing tag placed in the animal's ear, the tag will be clipped together and handed to the breeder. No officially typed animals, will be listed on the inspection sheet if the breeder does not want the typing tags.
- 4. All breeders will be required to communicate with breeders prior to and after their inspection to arrange a location to meet on time as arranged or scheduled. The schedule will be made as soon as all inspection forms and payments have been received.
- 5. Breeders that need to get the inspector to the airport for the next stage of travel are required to get the inspector to the airport two hours prior to departure. Any breeder that fails to get the inspector to the airport on time to board their flight will be responsible for booking a new flight at breeders' cost.

All breeders are responsible for lodging and meals during the time the inspector is with you.

Anyone who does not abide by these rules will be prevented from having inspections in the future.
